

# RURAL MUNICIPALITY OF COALFIELDS NO. 4

## BYLAW NO. 2024-03

### GENERAL ELECTION BYLAW

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The Council of the Rural Municipality of Coalfields No. 4 in the Province of Saskatchewan enacts as follows:

**1) SHORT TITLE**

This Bylaw may be cited as "The Election Bylaw."

**2) AUTHORITY**

The authority for this Bylaw is section 9.1 of *The Local Government Election Act, 2015*.

**3) PURPOSE**

This Bylaw addresses matters which Council may decide by bylaw or resolution. It is to be used in conjunction with *The Local Government Election Act, 2015*.

**4) DEFINITIONS**

In this Bylaw:

- a) "Act" means *The Local Government Election Act, 2015*;
- b) "Council" means the reeve and councillors of the Rural Municipality of Coalfields No. 4 elected pursuant to the provisions of *The Local Government Election Act, 2015*;
- c) "Municipality" means the Village of Frobisher;
- d) Definitions from within *The Local Government Election Act, 2015* shall apply here.

**5) ADVERTISING**

Advertising is to be completed as per section 9 of *The Act*. The following methods of advertising will be published as listed:

**5.1 Newspaper**

- All ads required to be published in a newspaper shall be in the Estevan Mercury.

**5.2 Conspicuous place in division in which an election is being held:**

- Reeve: All locations listed below.
- Division 1: Village of North Portal Community Hall bulletin board – 302 Belfast Street
- Division 2: Village of North Portal Community Hall bulletin board – 302 Belfast Street
- Division 3: Village of Roche Percee bulletin board – Birch Ave at Water Treatment Plant
- Division 4: Village of Frobisher bulletin board – 305 Third Street
- Division 5: Village of Frobisher bulletin board – 305 Third Street
- Division 6: Canada Post Bulletin board – 344 Walsh Street

**5.3 Electronic**

- The Municipality's website
- The Municipality's Facebook page

**6) DISCLOSURE OF CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS AND EXPENSES (section 34 of the Act)**

6.1 There will be no requirements for candidates to disclose contributions or expenses for a Municipal Election.

6.2 There will be no election campaign spending limits established.

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**7) NOMINATION DAY**

Nomination day shall remain as stated in stated in clause 73(1)(a) of *The Act*.

**8) CANDIDATES OCCUPATION (clause 9.1 (2)(c) of the Act)**

There will not be a requirement to list the candidate's occupation on the nomination paper and ballot for a Municipal Election.

**9) ELECTRONIC VOTING DEVICES (section 90 of the Act)**

Electronic voting devices will not be utilized by the municipality.

**10) FORM OF BALLOTS (section 91 of the Act)**

Names on the ballot will be arranged in alphabetical order, using the format: last name, first name, as per clause 91(1)(d) of *The Act*.

**11) MAIL-IN BALLOT SYSTEM (section 92 of the Act)**

Mail-in ballots will not be used for the Municipal Election.

**12) TIE VOTE**

In the case of a tie vote a by-election shall be held pursuant to section 141.1 of *The Act*.
